### b) Radar Speed Signs

We received a reply from Minister Mostyn to the Joint Council letter asking for radar signs prior to the landfill and C-6 road and by the Airport. In the past, Mayo has not met the requirements for installing radar speed signs. However, given the recent mining activity in the area and the increased traffic volume, 21HPW will conduct a traffic study this summer to determine if the necessary conditions are met and if they are, action will be taken. ### c) School Bus Route Clearing

We received a reply from Minister Mostyn to the Joint Council letter asking about HPW plowing the school bus route. HPW Staff will meet with Joint Council this summer to discuss the concerns and develop a plan for the next winter. For Council's information.

## d) Water/sewer project update

The Mayo Phase 3 Area 2 tender for underground infrastructure replacement closed and two bids were received. They were from Norcope and from Sidhu Trucking. YG is reviewing the tenders at this time. For Council's information. Discussed previously.

### e) Landfill Cleanup

We've put out the annual poster looking for an interested group or individual who is interested in doing the cleanup around the landfill fence and access road. The posting closed on April 12, 2019. One application was received from Mike McGinnis, on behalf of "Kids Helping Kids from J.V. Clark School in Mayo" and they will be doing the landfill cleanup prior to Victoria Day.

### f) YESAB review Topsoil and Gravel Quarries

YESAB is currently reviewing an application for topsoil and gravel quarries. The gravel quarry is proposed for an area just past the landfill on the way to Stewart and the topsoil quarry is proposed for closer to Stewart Crossing. The due date for comments to YESAB is April 23, 2019. For Council's review and comments. Council had no concerns with this application.

#### g) Mayo Fire Hall

We've arranged for a meeting with the YG Project Manager and Stantec to discuss the 65% architectural drawings of the new Fire Hall. This meeting will be at noon on April 18, 2019 in Village of Mayo Council Chambers. For Council's information.

# h) Denim Day - April 24, 2019

The sale of the Denim Day pins is going well. Marge at TD Bank has been a great help. The funds collected from the sale of the pins and Council's donation will be forwarded to the Yukon Cancer Care Fund to support people struggling to make ends meet while going through cancer treatment.
