6. <u>a) Mayor's Report</u>

Mayor Ellis brought up the recent water main leak in NND's east end. He mentioned that he is very grateful to the Village's Public Works Staff for being able to fix this major water leak. Due to the staff's expertise, knowing the Village's system, willingness to work day and night, they were able to repair the leaking water main while maintaining the flow of water to the community, preventing a boil water advisory, and being able to refill the reservoirs during this crisis. Scott Hamilton mentioned that Brendan Hutton, Wilf's Contracting Backhoe Operator had also helped not only with operating the equipment but also helping out in the trench. Council wants to recognize the Public Works Staff and Brendan for their dedication to the community at -40 Celcius weather to get a potential major crisis averted.

Council wants to remind NND Council that it is important for them to put capital dollars into upgrading/maintaining the water/sewer main lines in the east end area that was signed in September 1989, since NND still has over 40 occupied residences at this location.

Cst. Colin Lanthier-Dubois presented the RCMP Report to Council.

He also mentioned that he was successful in obtaining the Corporal position and will be replacing Alison when she leaves Mayo this spring.

b) Administration

i) CAO Report of Wednesday, March 1, 2023

a) Joint Council letters/minutes of February 8, 2023

I've drafted the Joint Council letters about the Mayo Health Centre Staffing and Air North requesting scheduled flights be brought back to Mayo. Mayor Ellis signed the letters, also the letter congratulating NND on celebrating the 50-year anniversary of "Together Today for our Children Tomorrow" and the upcoming 30-year anniversary of the signing of the Self-Government Agreement.

b) Hazard Assessment Plan and EMO Plan

As discussed at the Joint Council meeting, YG EMO, their contractor "Holistic", NND and the Village have scheduled 2-day in person meetings to discuss Village and NND EMO Plans and Hazard Assessments for Mayo. The dates have been scheduled for March 8 and 9 with an evening session for Joint Council, on March 8th. Invitations have been emailed to all potential participants. For Council's information.

c) Snow Clearing Policy draft

Due to the major water leak in NND's East End that that discovered on February 21st at 5 am, all Public Works Staff was so busy that they have not had the chance to review this draft policy. Once I receive the comments from the Public Works Staff, I will bring the draft policy to a future meeting for further discussion.

d) Official Community Plan (OCP)

The OCP bylaw is brought to Council for 1st reading. We could potentially hold the Public Hearing on March 27 or 28, which allows us enough time to get the two advertisements of the Public Hearing Notice into the newspaper in two consecutive weeks. Will this work for Council? Council did not have a preference for the Public Hearing date.

e) 2023 Property Tax Rate

I have put together a spreadsheet with properties that pay the minimum taxes, as well properties that have a dwelling on it but have not been occupied for some time. For Council's information and discussion, prior to setting the property tax rate and minimum tax for 2023.

Council discussed this issue. They decided to increase the minimum tax for residential properties to \$150 and for commercial properties to \$200 as of the 2023 tax year.

f) Landfill interim regional agreement

We received the final revised interim landfill agreement from AYC. It will be on the agenda of the March 3rd AYC Administrator's Form. If all the CAO's are okay with this version of the interim landfill agreement, then it will be up to the individual municipal Councils to approve and sign the agreements. For Council's information.

g) AYC Board meeting - agenda for Council's input

The next AYC Board meeting will be held on March 4, 2023 via zoom. For Council's information. Council did not have any comments at this time.

h) AYC AGM in Watson Lake

The 2023 AYC AGM will be in Watson Lake from May 11 in the evening to May 14. Who from Council is planning to addend this AGM? Councilors Paschuk and Aird are hoping to attend. Mayor Ellis and Councilors Andre and Chapman will decide at a later date.

i) Pool Update

The pool job postings closed on February 17th. We received several applications. Ian and I held interviews from Feb. 20 to 23, 2023. For Council's information. Two applicants were offered the pool positions, however, as of this time they have not accepted the positions.

They would also like to drill around the clock, and if we agree, the drilling of the two www's is expected to take approx. two weeks. The noise is expected to be like a truck idling at high.

Council discussed the importance of have the warm water wells drilled and installed asap, and therefore agrees to the drillers working around the clock
