### 6. a) Mayor's Report

Mayor Ellis mentioned that he had sent an email to YG Health & Social Services in regards to the vacancies at the Mayo Health Centre (Public Health Nurse, Nurse Practitioner, Admin. Assistant).

He also talked to Minister Mostyn during the AYC AGM about the deficiencies at the new Fire Hall and the Landfill capital needs.

Mayor Ellis mentioned that he did a walk through of the new Staff House on May 17<sup>th</sup> and it looks like a nice place to live which could attract staff for senior positions.

Mayor Ellis also spoke to the consultant for NND DC about the need to have a restaurant and sufficient accommodations in Mayo to be able to attract people to the community.

Mayor Ellis also mentioned that the Mayo Volunteer Fire Department received funding to build a BMX bike track. They are hoping that some of the soil that is being excavated from the 2023 water line replacement project can be put towards the bike track. The CAO will ask Sidhu about this during the project start up meeting on May 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Mayor Ellis mentioned to Council that he has an agenda item for Joint Council. If everyone is in favor, a joint council letter could be written to YG to ask to have derelict vehicles that have been alongside the highways for months could be hauled away.

Mayor Ellis is also still trying to get someone from SCAN to come to Mayo for a public meeting. The pamphlet that Councilor Champman and the RCMP worked on should go out to the public soon.

Mayor Ellis commented about the AYC AGM and that he enjoyed Christina Benty's presentations. It was mentioned that many citizens do not know what the municipality does.

### b) Administration

### i) CAO Report of Wednesday, May 17, 2023

## a) Official Community Plan Policy Discussion

Council had a discussion about the suggested policies following the Public Hearing. Since Mayor Ellis was not at the meeting when this discussion took place, I have brought the suggested policies back for discussion with Council as a whole.

## b) NND DC Restaurant building's future use

### c) <u>Landfill</u>

I've invited Dave Albisser to zoom into the meeting to further discuss landfill capital items and potential contracting out services. He has not confirmed yet if he'll be able to attend this or a future meeting. For Council's information.

#### d) Council Indemnity Bylaw

I have copied the Village's, Carmacks, Haines Junction and Faro's Council Indemnity Bylaws for review and discussion. For Council's consideration.

Council discussed Council indemnities and agreed that there should be a provision in the bylaw for additional work on an hourly basis that councilors do from time to time researching information or preparing a document about a particular subject.

The bylaw will be revised for Council's consideration.

#### e) JVC Grad Motion

#### i) Yukon 123 Fund

Yukon Government partnered with the Yukon Historical & Museums Association (YHMA) to administer the Yukon 125 Fund to mark the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Yukon Act that created the Yukon Territory.

Council's suggestions for this grant were a community video of the history of Mayo to now, street signs for the community, or a new playground toy.

## j) Posting summer student jobs

## k) Landfill Cleanup

No one put in a bid for the annual landfill cleanup. We have extended the deadline to May 19, 2023. For Council's information.

### I) Animal Protection and Control Act Regulations

We received a letter form Minister Clarke. YG would like to continue to engage with key stakeholders on the development of the regulations under the Animal Protection and Control Act. YG Environment would like to work with community officials to host a meeting in Mayo to hear citizens' views sometime between May to July 2023. For Council's information and discussion in regards to a possible date for this meeting. Council suggested a possible date in mid-June for such a meeting.

### m) Warm Water Well Drilling

Due to the changed start time of the project, the drillers lost their accommodations for the remainder of the drilling program. They have now decided to bring travel trailers to Mayo to finish out this project. For Council's information.

#### n) Shortage of Accommodations in Mayo

We've heard that Hecla has set aside the rooms at the Bedrock and the North Star for this summer. Is this something that should be followed up on? Why are they doing this? Are there no camp trailers available for their staff? This will severely impact trades that need to do work in the community. For Council's consideration.

The contractors that are supposed to install the NorthwesTel fibre line in Mayo booked the North Star.

Council is aware of the shortage of accommodations in Mayo and will advocate for more accommodations in Mayo.

## o) Environmental Health Trainee posting

We had not received any applications for the above position by closing on April 21, 2023. We have re-posted the position. For Council's information.

### p) New Fire Hall Report

We received an email from Mike Ukrainetz who was the YG Project Manager for the new Mayo Firehall. He attached the deficiency report that was prepared by Stantec. For Council's review and discussion.

Council would like to have the deficiencies addressed, especially the roof, as Mayor Ellis had indicated to Minister Mostyn during the AYC weekend.

## q) YEC Secondary Thermal Project

YEC submitted their proposal to YESAB and provided a copy to the Village of Mayo for information.

## r) 7th Avenue Extension Project

WSP is planning to hold a public meeting on June 1, 2023 from 7-9 pm at the J.V. Clark School Gym. For Council's information.

## s) NND 30th Anniversary of Self-Government

NND will be celebrating their 30-year anniversary of Self-Government on May 27-29, 2023 at Galena Park. For Council's information.

Mayor Ellis will be away during this weekend. He encouraged the other Council members to attend the festivities.

#### t) Road Infrastructure in Communities

We received an email from AYC stating that only Whitehorse, Teslin and Dawson own their own roads in the communities. We heard at the AYC AGM in Watson Lake that it is important for a municipality to have all their assets listed on their financials as it helps increase the CMG amount the municipality receives. For Council's consideration. Council is considering taking over the streets inside the Village of Mayo boundaries.

## u) CMG presentation

At the AYC AGM Shelly mentioned that they provided a CMG presentation to Dawson recently. She asked if any other community was interested in this also. For Council's consideration.

We received an update from YEC about the Mayo A power house and the slope behind the building. For Council's information.

#### w) Flowerbed Contest
